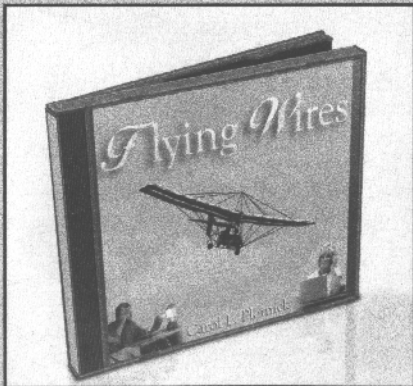


Passion Among Dacron Wings

“Flying Wires”



Maryland-based Chrysalis Publications has released “Flying Wires” in two electronic versions just in time for summertime reading.

Written by Carol Plotnick, a freelance writer for *Light Sport and Ultralight Flying* magazine and a former staffer with U.S. Ultralight Association, “Flying Wires” is a love story set among the Dacron wings of ultralight aircraft. “It’s a thrilling story about the love of flying these small aircraft, the love of good friends and the love that ignites passion,” Plotnick says.

Throughout the story, engaging dialog brings the characters to life. Through e-mail messages and eavesdropping on conversations at the airfield, the reader watches the years pass and the relationships change. There is humor as the

characters tease or taunt each other. There is frustration and fear, as students struggle with their flight training. There is enthusiasm and joy – on the ground and in the air. There is loss and sorrow when tragedy strikes.
